Catechism of the Catholic Church

583 Like the prophets before him Jesus expressed the deepest respect for the Temple in Jerusalem. It was in the Temple that Joseph and Mary presented him forty days after his birth.³⁴⁹ At the age of twelve he decided to remain in the Temple to remind his parents that he must be about his Father's business.³⁵⁰ He went there each year during his hidden life at least for Passover.³⁵¹ His public ministry itself was patterned by his pilgrimages to Jerusalem for the great Jewish feasts.³⁵²

Into the Deep Update

Dear Parishioners of Pastorate #1,
 Sunday, February 18, marked our 3rd meeting with the transition team. I want to thank our transition team for participating in this committee as it helps us to implement the Into the Deep Initiative in a more successful manner for our pastorate. The team turned in a brief history of each of their respective churches so that we can put them on a new pastorate website, which is under construction. **Remember, at this time, no financial merging has occurred. Our 6 parishes continue to exist as 6 parishes, and we haven't become 1 parish canonically or legally yet. I will communicate to the pastorate whenever something significant occurs, especially from a financial perspective. The purpose of our transition team meetings is to discuss things that may be happening in the future to our pastorate and to think through how we want to handle them as a parish family.**

In our meeting, we discussed more deeply the financial dynamics of our current 6 distinct parishes that have 4 schools and how it will change when we become 1 parish with our 4 schools. In our current set-up as 6 distinct parishes, each parish with a school makes up for whatever the school cannot raise in income. For example, through tuition and endowment, St. Clement School covers 62% of its expenses, St. Charles School covers 86% of its expenses, St. Andrew-Thomas School covers 69% of its expenses, and St. Mary's School covers 58% of its expenses. The remaining money is supplied by St. Clement Church, St. Charles Church, St. Andrew-Thomas Church, and St. Mary's Church respectively. The issue becomes more concerning if one or more schools are unable to continue to support themselves due to the cost of teachers/staff or the lack of teachers/staff, declining enrollment, or lack of financial resources. If this occurs, it means that the surrounding communities will have to carry more of the financial weight to keep the school operational. Again: the principle has always been that whatever a school cannot raise for itself will be subsidized by the parish, and in the new structure, we will be 1 parish with 4 schools. Because of this, we discussed various scenarios that could arise in the future, and every representative was able to express his/her own opinions about how the parish should respond if school income were to drop substantially for a particular school. We all affirmed that we want to have channels by which we can support our local Catholic schools, and yet, we agreed that we don't want our local Catholic schools to become a financial burden on the parish.

Ultimately, we agreed that the criteria would have to be established and thought through by the parish finance council, i.e. the "All Saints Finance Council" or the "Christ the King Finance Council" or the "St. Joseph the Worker Finance Council," to promote fairness amongst our Catholic Schools. Therefore, in the next month, I will be working with the 6 finance councils and choosing 1 representative per parish according to the number of Masses (like the transition team).

I look forward to sharing with you those representatives who will help to guide me so that we are being fair, responsible, and generous with each other, respecting each other, and cooperating with each other as a new family of Catholic faith called to make disciples of all nations.

I look forward to communicating more about this in the future.

Catholic Question & Answer

Question: Who invented the Stations of the Cross?

Answer: The first Stations of the Cross were walked by Jesus himself on the way to Calvary. Known as the "Via Dolorosa" ("The Way of Suffering") or the "Via Crucis" ("The Way of the Cross"), it was marked out from the earliest times. The early Christians in Jerusalem would walk the same pathway that Jesus walked, pausing for reflection and prayer. Later, when Christians could not travel to the Holy Land, artistic depictions of "The Way of the Cross" were set up in churches, or outside and Christians would walk from station to station, reading the Gospel account of the Passion, or simply praying and reflecting on each event. While the content or place of each station had changed, the intention was to make a mini-pilgrimage and follow--literally--in the footsteps of Jesus.

This devotion became better known in the Middle Ages, and the Franciscans are credited with its spread. Lent is a time when many people make the Stations, but anyone can pray the Stations at any time. It is a simple and personal reflection on the passion of Jesus and what it means to us.

St. Peter Julian Eymard, (1811-1868)

Peter Julian Eymard was born in La Mure d'Isère, France. When he was a child, he felt a strong calling to the priesthood and a devotion to Mary. He attempted to enter the Oblates of Mary Immaculate at age 18 but had to leave due to lung issues and migraines that disrupted his life. He was ordained a diocesan priest at the age of 23. After a few assignments, he chose to join the Marists and entered the Society of Mary seminary in Lyon, France.

While visiting neighboring Marist communities, Eymard experienced the perpetual adoration of the Eucharist for the first time. His devotion to Christ in the Blessed Sacrament grew and he decided to start a Marist community specifically devoted to perpetual adoration. He became known as the "Apostle of the Eucharist," and founded the Society of the Blessed Sacrament and the Servants of the Blessed Sacrament.

He promoted perpetual adoration, inspired those estranged from the Church to return, and worked to educate all about the love of Christ.
